Dhruba Chand Halder College, about five-minutes' walk from Dakshin Barasat railway station, on the Sealdah-Lakshmikantapur- Namkhana section, a co-educational institution, affiliated to the University of Calcutta, was established in 1965, by a group of dedicated social workers of the locality, for imparting education to students belonging primarily to the socially and economically backward classes of the Sunderban belt.

In the initial years, classes were held in Shibdas Acharya High School but in 1968, the college started functioning from its present site. Expansion in all branches has been instrumental in shaping its present stature.

This college was set up with financial contributions by two philanthropists-Dr. Dhruba Chand Halder (in whose memory the college has been re- named), a socially conscious physician hailing from Gocharan, and Baruni Devi, a kind hearted woman of Malighat village.

Under the leadership of Sri Sailendranath Halder, our founder Principal, three main streams of study, viz. Arts, Science and Commerce were set up, which soon became full-fledged units.

At present, the college also offers Post Graduate courses in different subjects, through its study centres affiliated to the Rabindra Bharati University (DDE) and Netaji Subhas Open University.



VISION AND MISSION

At Dakshin Barasat in South 24 Parganas, Dhruba Chand Halder College unfolds a vision of its own, giving priority to the needs, aspirations and spirit of the local inhabitants. Though "education" is our main "mantra", we do not encourage mere book-learning and writing examination papers. Our dream is to deliver value-based education, which, in the long run, makes "real men and women" (a concept initiated by Swami Vivekananda), and not just money-minded individuals. For



this, the college fosters act of kindness, service and sacrifice in the students. We envisage a kind of education that would help young learners realize their inner strength and potentialities and know their own selves inside out: "Bear no hatred, sow the seeds of love and friendship," is the message we send out to our students, so that we can contribute, though in a small way, to the formation of a better society.

The effective use of distance learning technology and implementing it in our academic curriculum is an integral part of our mission. Our endeavor is to improve the teaching-learning-research association of this college. We also wish to maintain a naturally beautiful campus, fostering ecological balance.

DR. DHRUBA CHAND HALDER

A GREAT SOCIAL WORKER



Dr. Dhruba Chand Halder (1898 - 1968)

In the early 1960s, a group of young educated people came forward and took great pains to establish the college. Dr. Dhruba Chand Halder, a physician & Smt. Baruni Devi, a widow of a neighbouring village, donated generously and Mr. Nanda Kishore Ghosh, a former member of the C.U. Senate, helped to get C.U. affiliation.

Dr. Halder hailed from Srikrishnanagar village, 4 km from the Gocharan railway station. After passing the Matriculation examination he joined the National Medical School. To provide medical treatment to the people, he opened a dispensary at Harrison Road (now M.G. Road) in a rented house where patients from his village and the nearby villages went for treatment. He provided shelter to many needy students and planned to establish a nursing home and a hostel for poor students. He devoted himself to disseminate higher education among the less privileged youth of South 24 Parganas.

He offered his savings spontaneously to build a college near his home with the help of Sudhanshu Sekhar Gayen, a young government employee, and a band of young and energetic social workers. Dr. Halder died in 1968. In accordance with his will, all his property was sold and the accrued money was deposited as donation to the college fund. After his death, Dakshin Barasat College was renamed "Dhruba Chand Halder College" in recognition of his contribution.

Baruni Devi, a child widow of the Malighat village, contributed much to the establishment of the present Dhruba Chand Halder College. She became instrumental in bringing the light of education to the eager students of her time. A humanitarian to the core, she also contributed a lot to the setting-up of the 'Padmer Haat' hospital, as well as bringing up a few orphan children. In memory of her, the boy's hostel of Dhruba Chand Halder College is named -'Baruni Devi Chhatrabas'. The college shall remain indebted to this great lady forever.

UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA

• 1. Duration of the Programme :

The College offers semester wise four-year B.A./ B.SC. / B. COM (honours with or without research) and semester wise three-year B.A /B.SC (multi-disciplinary) / B.COM courses of studies within the Curriculum and Credit Framework (CCF) 2022) under the affiliation of Calcutta University. There is an exit option after completion of Second Semester (certificate), Fourth Semester (Diploma) and Sixth Semester (Degree). A student pursuing a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters in all respect within a span of seven years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the student shall stand cancelled.

• 2. Important Guidelines :

All admissions shall be guided by the relevant guidelines of the University of Calcutta. A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of Four-Year B. A/B.Sc./B. Com (Honours Or Honours with Research courses) and Three Year B. A/B.Sc./B. Com Courses on passing H.S. (10 + 2) Examination. (Except Vocational Course & Distance Education Course)

• 3. Attendance :

A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.

A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.

A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or the date of admission, whichever is later.

B.A/B.SC/ B.Com 4 Year (Honours with or Without Research) Undergraduate Programme

Outline of CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):

- Category of subjects:
- A) **Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC):** A course, to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement of the Major subject.
- B) **Minor:** A subject of same broad discipline to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses other than the major subject.
- C) **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC courses:
 - a) Compulsory English
 - b) MIL/ Alternative English
 - * MIL includes: Bengali, Hindi & Urdu.
- **D)** Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. Student shall study 2 SECs based on Major subjects in 1st and 3rd semester. In the 2nd semester the student can study Artificial Intelligence (for Science discipline) or Digital Empowerment (for Humanities & Language discipline) or as specified in the syllabus of the concerned Major subject.
- **E) Practical/ Tutorial**: All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical/ Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa. Inclusion of P/TU components in SECs will be decided by the concerned UGBOS.
- F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC): These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values. There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.



- G) Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded three-year Single major Degree of 132 credits.
- **H)** Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC): There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters. The students shall take IDC from the different subjects other than the Major and Minor subjects.
- I) Research/ Dissertation:
- a) Students obtaining CGPA equivalent to 75% marks after successful completion of all the first 6 semesters may opt for Honours with research Degree Course in the 7th & 8th Semester.
- b) Students choosing a 4-year Bachelor's degree (Single major with Research course) are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member. The students shall have to complete the Research in the 7th & 8th semester of 4 credits and 8 credits respectively (total 12 credits).
- c) Students pursuing 4-year Single major Degree without Research shall have to take up to 1 additional DSCC (should be a Project work/ dissertation & the course will be of 4 credits) in 7th semester and 2 additional DSCCs (courses are of 4 credits each and at least one should be a Project Report/ Seminar) in 8th semester.

B.A/B.SC/ B.Com 3 Year (Multidisciplinary) Undergraduate Programme

Outline of CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):

- Category of subjects:
- **A) Core Course (CC):** Courses, to be compulsorily studied by a student as the requirement of Core subjects. The student shall select 3 subjects as core subjects.
- **B) Minor:** A subject to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses than the two core subjects.

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- C) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): AEC courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC Courses:
- a) Compulsory English
- b) MIL/ Alternative English
- * MIL includes: Bengali, Hindi & Urdu.
- **D) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):** These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. The students shall study 3 SECs 2 from each of 2 core subjects in 1st and 2nd semester respectively and in 3rd semester 1 SEC from the Minor subject.
- **E) Practical/ Tutorial**: All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical/ Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa. P/TU components in SECs will be as mentioned in the syllabus of the respective subject.
- F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC): These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values. There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.
- Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 (42+3) credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 (85+3) credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th semester and after successful completion of all the 6 semesters will be awarded B.A./ B.Sc. Degree of 128 (125+3) credits.
- **H)** Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC): There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters. The students shall select IDCs from the subjects other than the concerned core subjects & minor.

ADD ON COURSES

At the commencement of each academic session, this College offers some relevant Add on Courses with a view to enhance knowledge domain of the students and create new skills outside the prescribed syllabus. Students interested to opt for Add on Courses are required to contact the respective Course-in-Charge to register in a course as per availability.

COLLEGE ADMISSION

Students are required to apply online for admission to the different undergraduate courses, through the college website: dchcollege.org. Selected candidates have to make full payments of requisite fees, at the time of admission.

ADMISSION QUALIFICATIONS

A candidate who passed HS or equivalent examination (except Vocational Course & Distance Education Course) during the year 2021, 2022 or 2023 are allowed to apply in four year or three B.A., B.Sc., B. Com courses.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./ (Single-Major) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.

REQUISITE MARKS TO BE OBTAINED

- (a) A student taking up Major Course in a subject must have obtained:
- (i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

(ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

OR

50% marks in the aggregate when the student has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

(b) Students belonging to Reserved Categories taking up Major Course of Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be. (c) Seat reservation for admission in the first-year class of four-year (eight semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt. 26.05.2023.

A candidate who failed in a subject in HS or equivalent examination is not allowed to take that subject neither as Major nor as Minor Subject.

While applying for admission, a candidate belonging to EWS/S.C/ S. T/OBC-A/OBC-B category is to upload the certificate issued by D.M., A.D.M., S.D.O during application. No other certificates will be accepted except those mentioned above. DIFFERENTLY ABLED candidates are also to upload the certificate issued by Sub-Divisional Medical Officer.

A candidate who has participated in sports in Sub-Division level, district level or state level are to upload certificates from proper authorities.



Some Important Modalities and Instructions to Remember

- 1. The college reserves the right to admission. Submission of the application form along with requisite fees does not guarantee admission of the applicant.
- 2. The applicants must note that all admissions are provisional and subject to C.U. approval.
- 3. Any false information furnished in the application form is a punishable offence and renders cancellation of the candidature even if he/she gets admitted.
- 4. Eligibility to appear in C.U. Examinations are subject to attendance in classes as per C.U. norms.
- 5.A) Student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- 5.B) A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- 5.C) A candidate attending less than 60% of classes in one or more subjects/ groups of subjects will not be allowed to appear at the concerned examination.
- 6) Attendance in a subject/group of subjects shall be counted from the date of commencement of classes or admission to the course whichever is later.
- 7. As per the recent verdict of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, ragging and sexual harassment in any form are criminal offences. Students involved in either of these unlawful events will be liable to disciplinary action taken by the competent authorities. Also, students have to abide by the discipline in the College and the rules framed by the Calcutta University. Candidates with short fall of attendance in their classes will face disciplinary action as per C.U. guidelines.

DOCUMENTS NEEDED FOR ADMISSION

OTHER FEES TO BE PAID

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM: INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

• 1. Hostel facility for male students

For accommodation in the **Baruni Devi Chhatrabas**, students from distant places are required to apply in prescribed forms available at the hostel office. Hostel accommodation depends on the discretion of the hostel committee.

2. Library facility

The College has a good collection of books on all subjects taught in the college. The Central Library, with a spacious Reading Hall is housed in a separate building. There are also departmental libraries in all departments of the college. Students of both Honours & General Courses can borrow books, for a stipulated time, against library cards issued to them. Besides, the Central Library provides internet surfing facility, photocopy facility, online database searching facilities. It also organises Book Exhibitions annually.

3. Laboratory facilities

The College has developed well-equipped laboratories for facilitating the students' practical knowledge in the Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Micro-biology, Geography, Botany and Computer Science.
