

## **Concept Note**

Along with the rest of the world, India too is battling the Covid pandemic. As a result, we are going through a prolonged lockdown process. The lockdown measures in India have tremendous economic costs in the form of loss of output, income and employment in the economy. They have impacted both the demand conditions and supply potential of the Indian economy. Against this backdrop, the central government came out with stimulus packages of 20.97 lakh crore. According to the government, it consists of stimulus of Rs 12.95 lakh crore from the government and Rs. 8.02 lakh crore from the Reserve Bank of India. A majority of economists are of the opinion that the actual expenditures under the stimulus packages are much less than the government's claim. Keeping in mind the tremendous hardships suffered by the common people during the lockdown and after, many economists have suggested an urgent need of further increase in government expenditures to mitigate the distress of the people and resist the imminent recessionary tendencies in the economy. However, increasing government expenditures against the backdrop of a possible expected decline in revenue earning, may finally result in a huge fiscal deficit at an untenable level for a developing country like India.

During the lockdown period, state governments have also incurred huge revenue losses. Government stimulus measures have also not paid much attention to the fact of compensating state governments for their revenue losses. The state governments are finally responsible for citizens' welfare on the ground; therefore, deterioration in their fiscal positions is a big concern, especially when several states are already debt-burdened.
