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

LIBRARY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Once library cards are handed over, students can borrow books.
- 2. Each student is entitled to borrow 1 (one) book at a time.
- 3. Books can be borrowed by a student for a maximum period of 7 (seven) days, and can be re-issued twice after the first issue. The duration for each re-issue session will be of 7 days only.

- 4. Students can read books, journals, magazines and newspapers in the reading room on production of their College Fees Card, which will be treated as their temporary reading card.
- 5. For borrowing books to the home, i.e. for home issue, students have to submit requisition slip (available at the circulation counter on demand) within 10:00 am to 2:00 pm every day and required books are started to be issued from 12:30 onwards.
- 6. Students have to return books within the stipulated time, otherwise a fine of Re. 1/- per day per book will be charged.
- 7. Journals, magazines and newspapers are meant only for reading, not for home issue.
- 8. Students can photocopy (Xerox) library reference and textbooks at a very nominal charge, i.e. 50 paisa per page.
 - 9. Lost, damaged and defaced books should be replaced by students.
 - 10. Loss of library card must come into notice to the Librarian immediately. A fine of Rs. 10/- will be charged for issuing duplicate library card.
- 11. Full-time faculty members are entitled to issue 5 (five) books at a time and part-time faculty members are entitled for 3 (three) books at a time. In both cases, books can be taken for a period of maximum 1 (one) month. Books can be re-issued afterwards.
 - 12. Making of noise, gossiping, and use of mobile phones inside the library reading room are strictly prohibited.

WORKING HOURS Monday to Friday: 10:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. Saturday: 10:00 A.M. to 2 P.M. Library remains closed on Sundays and during holidays

BEST PRACTICES 2020-21

BEST PRACTICE (1)

1. Title of the Practice: "DUARE SHIKSHA" (BRINGING EDUCATION AT THE DOOR STEP)

2. Objective of the Practice: Because of the pandemic and subsequent lock-down, the institution had been declared closed for almost two years. As a result, teaching learning was affected to the most. Hence, the need for devising means of overcoming the problems, and finding solutions to these, was felt by both the teaching and learning communities.

3. The Context: The foremost challenge in this endeavor was to make the faculties technology-savvy. Once they became confident and well-practiced, were they able to deliver effectively. Creating WhatsApp groups, bringing students under the different umbrellas and acquainting them with the modern techniques of teaching-learning were also some of the issues that needed to be addressed.

4. The Practice: During the period of the lock down, the biggest challenge was, how to use modern technology for the benefit of the students and teachers. The extensive use of ICT s provided students with facilities to continue learning from their home. Fullfledged virtual classes were conducted through platforms like Google Meet and Zoom and Skype. Many departments uploaded relevant study materials on the website and posted recorded readings or study materials in their respective WhatsApp groups.

Faculties of the Science departments conducted on-line practical classes for the first time in the history of the institution. In addition, a series of webinars was organized by the different departments, which were attended by participants from other institutions as well. The range of activities was extended to include on-line sports, cultural activities, and various other programmes. This, of course, couldn't be made 100% problem-free. The students mostly residing in the interior villages, found it difficult to access a steady network. Poor electricity in many of the areas often prevented them from attending on-line classes. Moreover, with an average of 3 to 4 classes everyday (3-4 hours), their mobile data would get exhausted in no time, andre-charging was a great problem. Many of them could not afford to re-charge theirmobile data because of financial crisis. Many of the students did not have mobilephones either.

5. Evidence of Success: After a month of on-line classes, it was observed that the Honours students were interested and enthusiastic while attending classes. Moreover, the faculties realized that they were being able to deliver meaningful lectures without any disturbances. As a result, the prescribed syllabi could be completed well withintime, and students got the opportunity to interact better.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- a. Interrupted electric power supply in the rural villages of South 24 Parganas.
- b. Lack of mobile re-charging facility.
- c. Quick exhaustion of mobile data.
- d. The inability to buy smart phones.
- e. Poor connectivity

BEST PRACTICE (2)

1. Title of the Practice: "Let them Stand on their Own Feet"

2. Objective: The objective of this practice is to explore all possible avenues of providing financial assistance to students keen on learning, but unable to make arrangements on their own. The faculties and other staff members feel their plight and have been trying to bridge this gap, to the best of their abilities.

3. Context: The need for funding education for the students of this college became more apparent during the period pf lock-down, as the source of income had dried up for many. It was imperative that the college took the initiative to provide students with scholarships from various sources.

4. The Practice: Dhruba Chand Halder College has always been a pioneer in the area of procuring scholarships for the students of this institution.

• All girl students above the age of 18 are eligible for the 'Kanyashree 'scholarship, initiated by the Government of West Bengal. Under this scheme, even during the pandemic year, 108 such students received Rs 25,000 each, the process made easier by the college staff. This institution can take pride in the fact that for two consecutive years, it has been declared the most efficient in this regard, by the Government of West Bengal.

• Since our institution caters to the educational needs of the Sunderban belt, students here, are from different classes of society. It is therefore, the duty of the College to procure funds for them so that they can continue with their college education. The AIKYASHREE scholarship, ranging from Rs. 12,000 to 60,000, is rolled out to such students, by the Government of West Bengal. Again, the college staff is particularly helpful in this regard, helping the students from SC, ST, OBC get proper notifications, process their applications and see to it that they get their dues in time. 2101 students got this benefit during the pandemic year, amounting to Rs. 14,762,400.

• Other than these two, scholarships are also provided to the students from the Minority Communities, by the government of West Bengal. In 20-21, 4075 students got this benefit which amounted to Rs. 1,80,93000

• In addition, the College provides concessions to all the needy students, to the best of its capability. Students are required to apply individually to the Principal; these applications are scrutinized by a team of faculties, and based on their means and requirements, the amount is decided. In 20-21, 210 students got this benefit, and the total amount disbursed from college was Rs. 1,51020.

• The Vivekananda Merit cum Means scholarship was provided for 694 students, the amount of which was Rs 1,1016000.

5. Evidence of Success: Nearly all students eligible for different scholarships apply and get these and this makes them continue with their studies. Once the scheme takes way, the money is transferred to their individual bank accounts and they do not have to stand in a queue near the college office, for answers to their queries.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

• Dependence on the West Bengal Government for disbursement of funds.

• Inadequate institutional fund for increasing the concession amount.

• Overlapping of the Minority/ Aikyashree scholarships. • Due to poor network connectivity, students often fail to apply on-line, within the stipulated time.

BEST PRACTICES, 2019-20

"Esho, Kaaj Kori" (Come, let us Work) ---Entrepreneurship Skill Development

The art of manufacturing hand-made paper from scraps and discarded news-papers is not unknown in the modern age. Since paper is a very common solid waste in all households and institutions, a handful of students were trained to recycle these discarded papers so that they might put these to use while making paper-bags, paper-napkins and other things essential to mankind. This would not only help them learn something useful, but also help them set up a small business and help them earn some money. The seeds of entrepreneurship are thus sown in them at a young age so that eventually they may think and dream big, and, in the long run, even be able to support their families financially.

"Khel Khel Mein", (The Making of sports women/men, in the institution)

The importance of sports and games in any institution cannot be undermined at any stage. At DCH College, games and physical education play a big role in shaping the minds of a number of students, gifted with the talent of a sportsperson. The stake-holders feel that it is their duty to nurture such young hearts who, if provided adequate environment and support, can shine in their respective fields, bringing honour to all, helping them shape themselves. The College encourages sportspersons by giving them jerseys and boots, which amounted to Rs. 3, 25,063 in the session 2019-20. Cash prizes worth Rs. 52,500 were also given to the participants as prize money, for participating in Inter-district sports meet, in games like kabaddi and kho-kho. Besides these, some of them are also provided students' monetary concession when filling up the University examination forms. The impressive playground is used as a grooming ground for budding sportspersons of the area as well, and for this, an MOU has been signed by a local sports club, to groom players in different indigenous sports.

BEST PRACTICES, 2018-19

1. ENERGY AND SPACE SAVING DEVICE:

The Department of Botany at Dhruba Chand Halder College has been active in the thought of conservation of energy in the campus for some time. The teaching faculty here, came up with a novel idea of deriving maximum benefits, using minimum expenditure. The Science laboratories in most departments usually use rectangular or square tables for various experiments. This requires individual lighting arrangements so that the students can see, identify and examine the intricacies and minute details of their experiments. The teaching faculty of the department of Botany in this college have designed octagonal tables in such a way that only one bulb placed on a table can serve the purpose of a batch of many students at the same time. The original tables of 20 feet each, have been reduced to 12 feet each, enabling 6 students use one table at a time. The microscopes are placed in such a manner that 6 students can work on their experiments, using a single table at the same time. This not only checks the amount of energy exhausted, but also helps in space saving.



Map: 1 Map of the study area





Map: 2 Macro Topographical Image of the Study Area (Satellite Image)







Gender Sensitization and Sexual Harassment Policy of Dhruba Chand Halder College

1. Objectives: -

Dhruba Chand Halder College is committed to creating and maintaining a gender-sensitive and congenial democratic working environment in which students, faculty and staff can work together in a community free of violence, harassment, exploitation, intimidation and stress. It is expected that all students, faculty and staff treat each other with respect. Dhruba Chand Halder College is averse to all forms of gender violence, sexual harassment and discrimination on the basis of sex/gender or amongst the same sex members. Every member of Dhruba Chand Halder College should be aware that while the institute is committed to the right to freedom of expression and association, it strongly supports gender equality and opposes any form of gender discrimination and violence.

2. Definitions

According to the Supreme Court guideline, Sexual harassment can be defined as "unwelcome" sexually determined behaviour (whether directly or by implication) as:

- Physical contact and advances;
- Demand or request for sexual favours;
- Sexually coloured remarks;
- Showing pornography; and
- Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature.

The following is also covered under sexual harassment:

- Eve-teasing,*
- Unsavoury remarks,*
- Jokes causing or likely to cause awkwardness or embarrassment,*
- Innuendos and taunts,*
- Gender based insults or sexist remarks,*
- Unwelcome sexual overtone in any manner such as over telephone (obnoxious telephone calls) and the like,

- Touching or brushing against any part of the body and the like,
- Displaying pornographic or other offensive or derogatory pictures, cartoons, pamphlets or sayings,
- Forcible physical touch or molestation and
- Physical confinement against one's will and any other act likely to violate one's privacy.

* All these may be expressions of dislike for a person, but it must be kept in mind that behaviour of a person on and off campus should be maintained in a professional manner.

The following circumstances, among other circumstances, if it occurs or is present in relation to or connected with any act or behaviour of sexual harassment may amount to sexual harassment - :

- a) Implied or explicit promise of preferential treatment
- b) Implied or explicit threat of detrimental treatment
- c) Implied or explicit threat about her present or future status
- d) Creating an intimidating or offensive or hostile environment for her or
- e) Humiliating treatment likely to affect her health or safety.

3. Monitoring Mechanism

To facilitate a gender-sensitive and congenial working environment at Dhruba Chand Halder College(DCHC), a Gender Sensitization Cell has been formed which provides an exclusive platform to any member of the institute to air their grievances either in person or in writing. The Committee will play a proactive role towards sensitization of the DCHC community towards genderissues in order to provide a congenial working atmosphere to all its students, faculty andstaff. The Committee exists for the promotion of gender just and gender sensitive practices and activities within the Institute, including resolution of complaints of sexual harassment. The Committee is to be constituted of representatives from faculty and staff and representatives from students and 1 external member familiar with the issues relating to sexual harassment. The Convenor of the Committee shall be a woman, and at least half of its members should be women.

The term of each Committee shall be three years. The existing Committee will continue till the new Committee is constituted. In the event of the expiry of the term of Committee during the pendency of an enquiry then for purposes of that complaint, the previous Committee will be regarded as a valid Committee, till the submission of the Enquiry Report. The Committee shall meet at least once every semester, and on an emergency basis if any complaints are received. Members shall be intimated of meetings in writing or by electronic communication. Minutes of all meetings shall be recorded, confirmed and adopted. The Committee shall undertake one gender sensitisation session each year for all the members of the DCHC community.

The objectives of the Committee are:

- To promote gender amity among students, faculty and staff and to work towards creating an atmosphere promoting equality, non discrimination and gender sensitivity.
- To promote and facilitate measures to create a work and study environment that is free of sexual harassment.
- To recommend to the Director for changes/elaborations in the Rules for students in the Prospectus and the Bye-Laws, to make them gender just and to lay down procedures for the prohibition, resolution, settlement and prosecution of acts of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, by the students, faculty and staff
- To deal with cases of sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the complainants and termination of the harassment
- Recommend appropriate punitive action against the guilty party to the Principal.

4. Procedure for Enquiry

The Committee will deal with issues relating to sexual harassment within the campus of Dhruba Chand Halder College and is applicable to all students, staff and faculty. A complaint of discrimination or sexual harassment may be lodged by the victim or a third party within a period of three months from the date of incident and in case of a series of incidents, within a period of three months from the date of last incident. A complaint may be addressed to the Convener of the Committee. If the complaint is made to the Principal/President or any of the Committee members, they may forward it to the Convener of Gender Sensitization Cell. On receipt of a complaint, theCommittee shall record it in writing. Due attention must be paid to confidentiality of the complaints shall be entered in a register and shall be kept confidential. The Committee shall proceed with the complaint within 7 days from the receipt of the complaint.





The Committee shall proceed to make inquiry into the complaint following procedures in conformity with the principles of natural justice and gender sensitivity. The Committee shall have the right to summon, as many times as required, the defendant, complainant and/or any witnesses for the purpose of supplementary testimony and/or clarifications. The venue of the enquiry should take into consideration the convenience and security of the complainant. The Committee should be sensitive to covert forms of harassment that may be faced by the complainant. The identities of the Complainant and all witnesses shall throughout be protected and kept confidential by the Committee. During the enquiry proceedings the complainant and/or their witnesses and the defendant shall be called separately so as to ensure freedom of expression and an atmosphere free of intimidation. If required, any member of the Committee, if found to be closely associated with the defendant may recuse him/her self from the enquiry in case of a direct conflict of interest.

All proceedings of the Committee shall be recorded in writing. The record of the proceedings and the statement of witnesses shall be endorsed by the persons concerned in token of authenticity thereof. All persons heard by the Committee, as well as observers/nominees, shall take and observe an oath of secrecy about the proceedings to protect the dignity of the complainant and the defendant. All information received in the course of the examination and enquiry into a complaint of sexual harassment shall be held in trust by the concerned Committee and the same shall not be made available pursuant to an application under the Right to Information Act, 2005. Such information shall constitute an exception under Section 8 (e) of the Right to Information Act, 2005, as the same is held by the Committee in a fiduciary relationship and the non disclosure of the same will not be against public interest. To the contrary disclosure of such information may endanger the life or physical safety of the complainant or any of the witnesses. An exception to this Rule will be when the complainant herself applies for information under the Right to Information to this Rule will be when the complainant herself applies for information under the Right to Information Act, 2005. The Committee shall strive to complete the enquiry in the shortest possible time, preferable within two months from the date on which the complaint is referred to and not exceeding it.

After concluding its enquiry, the Committee shall prepare a detailed and written report of its findings. The enquiry report shall specify the details of the charge(s) against the defendant, the statements made and evidence presented in the enquiry and a discussion of the reasons upon which the findings arrived at by the Committee. The Committee shall provide a report of its findings to the employer within 10 days of completion of inquiry and such report shall

be made available to the concerned parties. No observations regarding the work and behaviour of either the complainant or defendant shall be made which are not related to the alleged act of sexual harassment. However, the Committee may consider as relevant any earlier complaints of sexual harassment against the defendant. In the event that the Committee finds the defendant guilty of sexual harassment, it shall also recommend the nature of disciplinary action (suspension, dismissal, or reference to sexual harassment as misconduct in service book etc.) to be taken taking into consideration the gravity of the offence of which s/he has been found guilty and the impact on the complainant. The disciplinary action will commensurate with the nature and impact of the sexual harassment. It shall also recommend whether after disciplinary action has been taken, the Administration should publicize the identity of the offender, the misconduct and the disciplinary action taken.

- The College also facilitates students and advanced learners to pursue higher education in open and distance mode learning within the college campus. The college holds Study Centres of Distance Education of Rabindra Bharati and Netaji Subhash Open University.
- The college provides smart classes to facilitate teaching-learning methods in an enjoyable and effective manner.
- The college ventures several Add-on courses run by different departments along with the regular degree programmes to mould the students with employable skills. These courses

incite their interest as they can opt for a course of their choice and equip themselves and increase their employability.

- The college provides the facility of several professional computer courses through its computer centre set up in the campus. This centre prepares the students for the advancement of their position in the professional field.
- Dhruba Chand Halder college offers Language Laboratory for its students to learn the English language in a joyful and practical way. It is designed to facilitate classroom learning and aid them to overcome the fear and hesitation of speaking in the English language.
- The college has a professionally designed website which is meticulously maintained and is always kept updated.
- The college maintains a mentor-mentee system to guide on both educational and personal aspects.
- The college is not only situated amid the green lushes of nature, it also promotes sustainable and eco-friendly practices in the campus.
- The college has the facility of adequate backup power generator during the time of power outage.
- Though being located in a rural area, the college provides good internet connectivity all over the campus which helps in extending ICT based teaching-learning.
- Apart from a central library the college has departmental libraries in each department to satisfy the need for information and provide relevant material and support the academic programme.
- The college provides the facility of regular and emergency medical screening of students within the college premises.
- This college believes in student-centric learning focusing the attention from the teachers to the students. This method includes active learning, increasing problem-solving ability through discussion, debate, explanation and formulating arguments.
- The college is proud of its students' outstanding performance in sports and athletics at different levels. A good number of awards and medals are owned by the students of this college.
- Different departments separately involve themselves in multifarious social/community outreach programmes, like giving learning, social planning, health support, and other projects for their welfare. These programmes are organized by the departments with a view to bringing growth to society and the people around us, raising social awareness on sensitive matters and becoming a means of providing new, innovative solutions to health, and socio-economic challenges.
- The college encourages co-curricular and extra-curricular activities that are carried out beyond the regular course of study.School sports teams, cultural programmes to observe special occasions, extempore, writing competitions, poster-makingcompetitions, debates,

mock parliament, drawing competitions and theatre performances are examples of a few common co-curricular activities.

- The college encourages educational trips to different departments to upgrade their skills in a practical and interesting manner. The students learn better when something that they simply read in a book and memorize theoretically can perceive in a real situation. This also creates bonding among the students and between the students and teachers.
- Different departments of the college publish departmental magazines to bring out the hidden literary talents in the students and also to inculcate writing skills among them. These magazinesmotivate young learners to brainstorm ideas on what they can contribute to the publication. This sharpens their thinking skills and gives them the necessary confidence to express themselves better.
- Every year the college holds an Annual cultural competition and Social as annual festivals to motivate the students to identify themselves with the college. Their active involvement improves skills such as organizational, presentation, leadership and interpersonal communication. Professional performing artists are also typically invited, and a number of competitions are held for students.
- The college has a formal student-feedback mechanism initiated by IQAC to ensure the quality of performance by the teaching resources and analyze the deficiency in the system of the college as a whole to serve the students in a better way.
- The college offers various student-friendly services, e.g. scholarships, awards, incentives etc. through the Student Welfare committee to motivate and help the students to continue with their higher education successfully.
- The college emphasizes lab-based learning as a relevant and essential part of learning that gives students first-hand experience and offers better opportunities for learning. So, all the science departments of the college are well equipped to allow students to actually perform experiments rather than just read about them.
- The career counselling cell of the college makes the student aware of various career opportunities and creates placement opportunities by inviting employers and coordinating the placement activity in campus.

OUR WEAKNESS:

- Being situated in a rural area and of poor communication to this place, the college lags behind in creating job opportunities for students through campussing.
- Involvement of faculty in research activity is not adequate.
- The area of collaboration, consultancy and linkage is also inadequate.
- In different departments of the college there are large number of students, but in comparison to that the teaching posts are inadequate. Our college is suffering from shortage of permanent faculty due to Government's teacher recruitment and post creation policy.

OPPORTUNITY

- The college has opportunity to provide the facility of a girls hostel But the college is considering a lot of relevant concerns related to socio-cultural problems and security issues before finalizing the agenda.
- Having enormous student strength and a good number of competent faculties, the college has the opportunity to open PG courses in the college campus.
- The college being located in rural area, far from the city, there is demand in the college to open need based courses. In future, college may design and plan few need based courses as per the demand.
- The college has competent faculty to organize specialized training programmes to increase their skills in different areas of teaching and learning.
- The college has opportunity to create a better relationship and network among the stakeholders of the college for more productivity in future days.
- A large Number of students have demonstrated outstanding performance in sports and games. There is a scope of providing further support to them.
- Very recently, the Alumni association of the college(Saraswat) has been registered under the West Bengal Society Registration Act,1962. The college is yet to develop an Alumni tracking/management system for the organization of the student community and create a connection with the institution.

CHALLENGES

- The college receives limited Government grants and allocations which are not enough to augment the infrastructural facilities needed for this **student-heavy** college.
- A lot of students who take admission in this college belong to socio-economically backward class. The college faces challenge in helping them as they have diverse issues caused mainly due to economic and social inadequacy. Ensuring regularity of student's attendance owing to socio-economic reason remains a challenge.
- Reducing the drop-out rate of students owing to socio-economic reason is a real challenge.
